How are students assigned to schools?

Students are assigned to schools based on their residence. There are 17 elementary schools, including seven magnet options: Kennedy Academy, Nuner Fine Arts Academy, Marquette Montessori Academy, Madison STEAM Academy, McKinley's Dual Language Immersion Program, Hamilton Traditional School, and Swanson Traditional School. There are six middle schools, including four magnet options: Dickinson Fine Arts Academy, Jefferson Traditional School, LaSalle Academy, and Jackson's Project Lead the Way. There is one K-8 magnet school, Clay International Academy. Students throughout the corporation may apply for admission to the magnet schools. Students are admitted based on capacity and racial compliance.

### Our School:

Nuner was named after John F. Nuner, South Bend Schools superintendent from 1916-1919. Nuner School was first occupied in February 1923. It replaced the old River Park School, a two-room school which served only 40 pupils when it opened in 1893. A new Nuner was opened in 1999, a block south of the former building. The building appears to be one story, but is actually two stories with a large portion of the complex built into the hillside.

Today, Nuner serves over 350 students.

Nuner's school colors are blue and yellow, and our mascot is the Nuner Knight.
